

The Process of Creative Writing

The six steps to having great ideas are:

Step 1 - Gather your information

Gather information by observing people and the world around you. Take interest in how people live, what they think and why they behave in a certain way. Also, read widely. Read the newspapers as well as novels. Do your research and write down interesting facts.)





Step 2 - Sift through the information

See how all the information can fit together. Find the link between some of them. While doing this, you may have more ideas coming to you. The more you sift through the information. the more ideas you will have and the better you will understand them.

Step 3 - Let the information grow

The next stage is to let the information grow and develop in your mind. It's a good idea to do something else for a while. Listen to some music or go for a walk to relax and to stimulate your imagination and emotions. As you do this, the magical moment may suddenly appear.





Step 4 - The magical moment! Let the ideas flow




