




'We wanted to give the people from our generation the chance to take a walk down memory lane and savour local delights prepared from makeshift carts, just like the good old days," Mr Tan explained.


#### Location

As a city child, Ah Ma's hut was the first wooden hut I saw. It had been Ben's home for the first four years of his life. 


