






# Saving Endangered Wildlife

Despite mounting global efforts to save endangered wildlife, some species of wildlife still cannot escape the fate of vanishing from the Earth, Various educational programmes and measures have been put in place worldwide to prevent populations of endangered wildlife from decreasing further. Trying to curb the dwindling numbers is a never-ending challenge.



#### Zoos

Wild animals are kept in captivity in zoos. Some have been soved from extinction by their breeding programmes. However, some animal activists object to this idea. They believe the animals are held in poor and cramped conditions.

#### Madine sunctivaties and Mational Farks

These places keep animals safe from being killed illegally. For example. African wildlife sanctuaries allow African Elephants to breed in safe environments. This results in an increase in their population. However, locals sametimes object to sanctuaries being established because it may deprive them of the usage of land. They can no longer use the land for traditional forming or hunting.
