People have become more aware of the harm that plastic straws are causing the environment. More than 500 million plastic straws are used in United States each day. Too small to recycle, they usually end up in the sea. **There**, they choke sea creatures, clog coral reefs, and eventually break down into tiny parts and get eaten by fish.

Many people around the world understand the strong need to save the environment. More effort is being put in by many countries to reduce the use of plastic straws. In February 2018, the Queen of England eliminated plastic straws in all the royal palaces. The royal family also pledged to reduce the usage of single-use plastics such as cups, plates, and utensils at royal functions.

Many companies have joined the fight to do away with plastic straws. The fast food restaurant in the United Kingdom, McDonald's Corporation, has switched to using paper straws and will only provide them upon customers' request.

Another restaurant named Pizza Express was also spurred to make the change after receiving a letter from their five-year-old customer, Ava. Ava was sad when she read that sea animals were being harmed by the discarded straws and decided to do something. She wrote in to Pizza Express and requested it to stop using plastic straws.

Seeing the approach of Mcdonald's Corporation and Pizza Express, Marriot Hotel has decided to follow suit and announced that they would ban straws and stop giving out plastic bottles of shampoo and soap to their hotel guests by the end of the month. With so many people around the world helping to reduce the use of straws, totally giving up plastic straws would one day be a possible scenario.
